Council for Quality Growth Internship/Practicum Educational Objective and Work Expectations

Objective: To teach students about real world public policy issues through research on the impact(s) of local government decisions on growth and development in the Greater Metropolitan Atlanta Area.

Work Expectations: Students will be expected to conduct certain work activities which include but are not limited to the following duties:

1. Research various public policy issues affecting the growth and development industry.
2. Report the findings of such research to Council staff and its members. This may be done in the form of reports, briefs, news articles, flash faxes, databases, other media formats, and/or public speeches.
3. Attend, participate, and report on various public meetings and citizen advisory activities. Examples include City Council, County Board of Commissioners, Planning Commission, Development Advisory Committee, ARC, GRTA, DNR, EPA, EPD, DCA, stakeholder meetings, etc.
4. Assist Council staff with formulating policy positions on various issues.

NOTE FOR STUDENTS SEEKING COURSE CREDIT(S): *The Council will work with you and your academic advisor/professor to determine the appropriate project for your specific internship. In addition to your duties and responsibilities at the Council, you will likely be asked by your academic advisor/professor to keep a daily journal of your work experiences and to write a paper about the work you complete at the Council.
