Course Overview:

This course will provide an overview of the fundamentals of financial management. Topics that will be covered include: Financial statements, markets, and assets, as well as financial analysis and capital structure. We will stress, throughout this course, the practical application of these topics to real-life business issues. The course syllabus is a general plan for the course; deviations announced to the class by the instructor may be necessary.
